Anil Kumble : The New Face Of Indian Cricket

"Anil is a fabulous player, a hard competitor who will not make any

compromises in the field " said Sachin Tendulkar.

Carrying with him an experience of almost 20 years, Mr. Anil Kumble has emerged as the choice of the BCCI to take up the job as the eagerly awaited head coach of the Indian cricket team. Anil Kumble is a right-arm leg

spinner (leg break googly) with an

unorthodox style, most famous for his flippers. He started his career as a fast bowler, which gave him a faster-than-usual delivery.

Born on 17th October, 1970, the Bengaluru man debuted in a first-class match for Karnataka on 30th October, 1989, against Hyderabad at the age of 19, taking 4 wickets with a pair.

Kumble, not a big turner of the ball, rather relied much on pace and accuracy. His ability to make the ball bounce with subtle variations in pace made him a tougher bowler to face for the batsman, thus earning him the nickname "Jumbo".

After a glorious span of 18 years of playing active cricket, Anil "Jumbo" Kumble announced his retirement from all forms cricket in the month of November, 2008.

Honours & Achievements:-Jumbo ended his glorious career with 619 wickets in test cricket and remains the 3rd highest wicket-taker trailing Muttiah Muralitharan and "The King of Spin", Shane Warne.

The "Indian Cricketer of the Year" awardee was given this honour in 1993 after which he was honoured by the Arjuna Award in 1995. Just in the next year, in 1996, he was recognised as one of the Wisden Cricketers of the Year along with Dominic Cork (England), Aravinda de Silva (Sri Lanka), Angus Fraser (England), Dermot Reeve (England).

In the year 2002, he was shortlisted among 16 cricketers for the Wisden Indian Cricketer of the Year which saw Kapil Dev emerging as the winner.

He was awarded India's 4th highest civilian honour in 2005, the Padma Shri. Later in October 2012, he was appointed the Chairman of the International Cricket Council. In February

2015, he was officially inducted into the ICC Hall of Fame which features other Indian greats like Kapil Dev and Sunil Gavaskar. One of his best achievements enthroned in every cricket heart around the globe is his 10 wicket innings in a test match in 1999 against India's most controversial rival, Pakistan. This feat has only been achieved by one other bowler in cricket history, who hails from England against Australia, in the year 1956, James "Jim" Charles Laker.

Some of Kumble's other accolades includes a prominent intersection in M.G. Road, Bengaluru being named as Anil Kumble Circle, a "Best Breakthrough Performance in IPL" in 2009 for his 5 for 5 against Rajasthan Royals, and an induction into the "ICC Cricket Hall of Fame" in the year 2015.
