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

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
KILL THOSE WEEK END BLUES

HOW TO Make a Drum and Drum Sticks



Below is the paper folding instructions to make the drum.



(1) Cut out a rectangle that is about 8 inches x 2 inches long (2) Make a crease that is about 1/2 inch from the bottom (as seen above). (3) Make vertical cuts (up and down) from edge to edge along this crease (see the image above). (4) Paste ends together so that it forms a cylinder-like shape. (5) Remember when you made all of those cuts along the bottom of this paper...now fold them in. (6) Cut a circle that fits the cylinder shape that you just made. (7) Paste this circle onto the slits of paper you just cut and folded in.

To Make the Drum Sticks, you can either use toothpicks or make them from clay.

Now find a suitable place in the school where you can beat the drum as you sing your favourite song.!!

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Who is the Easter Bunny?

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
